River Clean Up 2025

The municipal multi-disciplinary team from Midvaal roads, parks, law enforcement, and Fire and Rescue put in a tremendous effort in early December to clear the blockage at Saloojees Bridge, and it can be reported that for the first time in many years, the river is able to pass freely underneath the bridge.

Our volunteer-based river clean-up campaign started activities for the New Year on Saturday morning, the 4th of January, with a large team of volunteers coming together and focusing their work on clearing the debris on the eastern side of the weir, at the end of Windsor Avenue. This side continues to cause the biggest concern, as the construction of the culverts is inadequate to allow free passage of driftwood, and we experience frequent blockages on that side. The natural flow of the river curves just ahead of the weir and pushes all floating material towards the eastern side, causing

such blockages. We have expanded our discussions further to the national and provincial levels with the relevant authorities and hope to establish clear lines of responsibility to have the structure of the culverts on the eastern embankment altered to allow for clear passage of floating debris.

In the meantime we are planning a further cleanup action using heavy machinery that is able to reach and remove large tree stumps, logs, and debris that have accumulated in front of the weir. Here we have to wait for the river flow to subside to allow for the safe operation of such machinery on top of the weir. As we are volunteer-based and privately funded, we are appealing for financial assistance to help pay for the cost of such an operation and also ask that local residents with access to construction machinery such as a front-end loader or TLB come forward and assist by making the equipment

and an operator available.

The illegal dumping of garden waste and refuse by residents along the path of the river in Henley remains a major problem and worsens the speed at which we have blockages occurring. We encourage residents who witness such dumping of garden waste to report the guilty party to the Midvaal authorities either telephonically or via the Midvaal mobile app. The recommended legal method to dispose of garden waste is the transfer station in Galloway Street, Meyerton, or through a contracted garden service.

Looking at images of the weir from many years ago and the attraction it created for recreational activities around it, there is much that still needs to be done to get its condition back to this status safely. Presently the flow of the river at the weir represents a dangerous and life-threatening situation, as we have witnessed over the years with many tragic incidents and the

last tragic drowning occurring on 22 November 2024. Warning signs and barriers have been erected for that reason, but they continue to be ignored. We have to recognise that increased water flow caused by rapid urbanisation upstream, industrial wastewaters, and climate change are all contributing to increased volumes of water having to pass through the course of the river. Residents and visitors to the village need to be extra careful, and river crossings or wading along the top of the weir whilst water is flowing over it presents a significant risk to life and must be stopped.

A huge thanks goes out to the team who continually contribute to the clearing of the debris and the ongoing discussions with the authorities to find a permanent solution to the problematic situation that we find ourselves in.

2024 was a difficult year for many, with the lack of rain, collapsing economy, ongoing retrenchments, and general uncertainty. I am not sure that 2025 will be much better. Predictions of an uptick in the economy might make us feel better, but it won't filter through to our pockets for a while. The late summer rains, while being very welcome, have brought with them the perennial problems of potholes, stormwater drain blockages, and possible river flooding. The ever-increasing number of potholes should in many cases require a

resurfacing of the road; however, due to budget limitations, they can only be repaired.

A twenty-year future plan for roads and stormwater drainage in Midvaal has been completed. It appears that an amount of R1.5 billion will be required to bring these up to an acceptable standard. This is equal to Midvaal's total annual budget. Where and how the money is spent is dependent on grant funding from the province and government as well as long-term borrowing. The final decision is made by the mayor and his MMCs.

A by-election takes place in Ward 1 in Midvaal on the 5th of February due to the untimely

death of the sitting councillor. Ward 1 covers a very large area east of Vereeniging towards Villiers and includes Vaal Dam. Many residents are putting out their refuse bags on days before collection. The result is that dogs and vagrants rip the bags and empty the litter onto the pavements. Not only does this leave our pavements filthy, but the cost of cleaning up is exorbitant. Please put your refuse out on a Thursday morning in a suitable plastic bag. The bottle banks are a private initiative for the collection of bottles and glass, which should be placed into the container and not dumped alongside it in plastic bags and cardboard boxes. The dumping is an eyesore for residents, particularly those in

close proximity to the containers, so please respect your fellow Henleyites and do the right thing.

The Oval Park gym and children's playground equipment and the basketball practice court have been a resounding success.

Unfortunately, a few people spoil the fun for everyone... Adults have been playing on the children's swings and breaking them while youngsters are sitting on benches under the trees drinking alcohol and leaving smashed bottles lying around. This behaviour is unacceptable and is very difficult to monitor without putting in full-time security.

From the Henley CPF

The members of the Henley Community Policing Forum (HCPF) continued their patrol roster throughout the festive season. This period of the year is typically a period with high levels of crime for break-ins and theft from property, and 2024 was unfortunately no exception. We have experienced a spate of

gate motor thefts and a number of break-ins and

thefts from property during the period.

We continue to receive great support from a number of active private security companies in the village and encourage residents to report suspicious situations or suspicious behaviour to these security companies, even if they are not paying members of their security services. Response numbers for these companies are posted on all the signboards, and it is recommended for everyone to store these numbers on their phones for rapid access.

The lack of crime awareness and precautions against crime remains a major factor in why criminals continue to be successful in Henley. It is everyone's responsibility to remain vigilant and aware of this potential threat at all times. Leaving valuable items within

plain sight in your garden or in the motor vehicle only presents an irresistible temptation to the criminal, who will scout the opportunity, observe movement throughout day and night, and plan to strike when it is least expected.

Valuable items that cannot be taken out of plain sight, such as gate motors, motorbikes, or trailers, need to be secured adequately through the use of anti-theft brackets or chain and steel cable locks. When entering or leaving your property, ensure that the gates are closed behind you.

Criminals prefer to work in the dark and remain undetected, so residents need to ensure that their perimeter is well lit and excessive vegetation that presents an opportunity for hiding spots is trimmed or removed altogether. Any item or material around the perimeter, inside or outside of the property, that can be used as a stepping aid to gain access over the fence

must be removed.

Another important aspect in fighting crime is to know your neighbours, the layout of the property and items on-site, and the movements of the occupants inside the property. By being aware and knowledgeable of our surroundings, suspicious observations and circumstances can be reported to the neighbour or the security company before an incident of crime occurs.

We encourage residents to visit our website https://www.henley-cpf.co.za/ and familiarise themselves with the work that we do. The HCPF is a volunteer-based organisation that relies on the time of volunteer patrollers twice a month for a 2-hour patrol. Membership is free of charge and subject to SAPS police clearance. 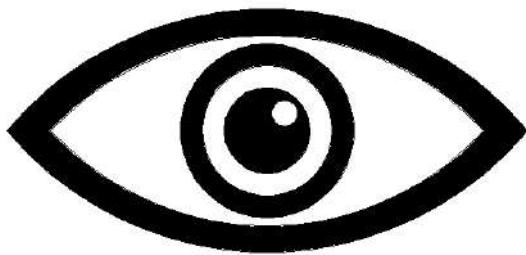
Kan jy glo loadshedding is verby!

Henley Watch says Goodbye



It is with a sense of sadness that we confirm the closure of Henley Watch at the end of January 2025. After 34 years of dedicated service to the community, our organisation will be disbanded, and our airwaves will go silent.

At our recent AGM, it was accepted that we no longer have the membership needed to operate effectively. This decision was not taken lightly, but increasing costs and decreasing income mean it is no longer financially viable to cover

the costs of alarm monitoring and response services. On considering the options for the future, the majority voted in favour of

transferring this service to Afri Guard (Pty) Ltd as a group. This is to allow for the smoothest transition for many alarm systems at once and optimum security coverage for our community.

Founded in November 1990 as a non-profit organisation, Henley Watch was a direct response to the escalating crime wave sweeping the country at the time. Similar to neighbourhood watch groups popular in those days, Henley Watch had the added benefit of an emergency

number and alarm systems connected to a network that was monitored 24 hours a day. For many families, 'The Watch' was an integral part of their lives. Connections were made and friendships were formed with a shared vision for a crime-free community. Given that so much has changed in our country and community in three decades, it is quite remarkable that a neighbourhood watch was able to adapt and survive so long almost solely on the strength of volunteers.

We extend heartfelt thanks to our devoted volunteers and loyal members who have been part of this journey. We are particularly grateful to our Executive Committee members, to Chris van den Heuvel for his dedicated technical support, and our unsung heroes who have manned the mobases since inception. If it wasn't for Henley Watch, countless paths may never have crossed. May the spirit of community remain as we all continue to watch our neighbours' backs.

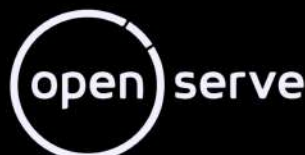

a bee suit, and Ben is allergic to bee stings. We found a reputable beekeeping store nearby, and they had reasonable prices. In areas like Pretoria and Randburg, you can pay up to R10000 for your bee suit and essential equipment. We had limited funds, so pricing was key at this stage. Ben also needed a mentor and some training; Google and YouTube are great, but the expertise of an experienced beekeeper cannot be understated.

We found our heroes at the local bee equipment store in Vanderbijlpark, only 25 km from us, with all the necessary equipment at great prices. The owner has vast experience and has over 50 hives of his own. He collected over 2 tonnes of honey last year, so he knows his stuff. The advice he has given to Ben has been invaluable, and Ben and I are learning continually. The basic equipment you will need, whether you just want to do beekeeping as a hobby or start a business, is the following:
A bee suit with a meshed hat attached
Strong long gloves
Ankle gators
Thick boots or wellington boots
A bee tool to lift up the lids of the bee box
A smoker
A brood box with 10 frames
And a super box with 10 frames to add on top of the brood box once the bees are

established in the brood box. A queen bee separator to stop the queen from getting into the super box to lay eggs.

We will explain the brood box and super box in detail in our next article. And last of all, but very important, "the Bee Bible, a book called Beekeeping in South Africa, a book first published 50 years ago, now in its fourth edition, all about working with South African bees with the most relevant information you will need to know on your bee adventure. There is so much more to tell, so we will have to continue our bee story in a few more articles. We hope you will find all this bee talk interesting and maybe spark a new hobby in the near future.

Of course, being me, I can't leave you without a recipe. Honey and nut-baked pears

- Ingredients**
4 pears
150g butter
1 teaspoon cinnamon
2 tablespoons raw honey
1 cup cornflakes, crushed
100 g crushed pecan nuts

Method
 Set oven to 200°. Cut pears in half, remove cores, dot with a knob of butter, save the remaining butter for sauce, sprinkle pears with cinnamon, place on a baking sheet, and bake for 5 mins so pears can soften. In the meantime, microwave the remaining butter with honey for 30 seconds, then toss crushed cornflakes and pecans in the mixture. Remove pears from oven and top with the cornflake mixture; bake for a further 5 to 7 mins until golden brown. Remove from oven and cool; cornflakes will crisp up again as they cool. Serve with a scoop of ice cream and enjoy.

Heavenly Herbs and Honey

Heavenly Herbs was started by Ben and me in 2017. We were growing potted herbs in tunnels, but like many other small businesses, we were badly hit by Covid, and our herb venture took a nosedive. One morning about 18 months ago, Ben woke up with a "bee in his bonnet," a dream to work with nature, building hives and keeping some bees.

Ben grew up in a small village in the Eastern Cape with his grandmother. There he worked with goats, cows, sheep, donkeys, and chickens and learnt how to grow crops in an environmentally friendly way. He swam in the cold mountain streams and encountered wild bees while collecting wood and fetching stray animals in the natural forest on the edge of the village.

He became an avid nature lover and was taught by Grandma about local African herbs and how to make ancient African remedies. He moved up to Gauteng to join his mother when he was 11 years old. Speaking Xhosa and very little English, it was hard to fit in, but

with determination he made his way. He even went to a famous Afrikaans high school in Heidelberg, where he learnt to speak Afrikaans, played rugby, and became a provincial cross-country champion, winning many trophies for his school.

Ben started experimenting and built his first beehive box out of pallet wood around August 2023. He had barely finished this first box when a swarm of bees moved in. He hurriedly finished a second box and, in fact, was putting in the honeycomb frames when the second swarm arrived; he didn't even have time to place the box under the trees out of the hot sun. At this stage he had no bee suit, so he waited until it was dark and dressed in jeans, a tracksuit, and boots taped with masking tape and my fancy table net wrapped around his head, to move the second hive under the trees. I wish I had taken a photo of his strange outfit; he looked like a character from a Halloween movie. Now he was well and truly in the business of beekeeping, and we desperately needed the right equipment; it is extremely dangerous to handle bees without
